
The footpaths

4 Circuit des Fougères

Walking amongst ferns (feuges in local dialect), a magnificent meadow and the forest of Prémol, inhale the fresh mountain air on this enchanting walk.

- **Departure** :-- Either from Le Recoin de Chamrousse or the Baraque de Boulac. Access: From Uriage, at the first roundabout coming from Gieres, follow signs "Chamrousse 1650 / Saint-Martin d'Uriage". Pass through Saint-Martin d'Uriage and continue on the D111 to Chamrousse. The Vernon car park is on the right behind the petrol station after the first roundabout in Le Recoin.
- Alt. 1600 m ··· From the Vernon car park, take Rue des Anémones and descend towards the water reservoir, passing around it on the left. Walk up towards the military buildings where the path begins by descending in the direction of Saint-Martin d'Uriage (the Clots path). After two zig-zags, the descent becomes gentler. Continue for 50 m before turning left below onto a forest track which leads to a clearing in the middle of the ferns, called "place des feuges or Fern Square" in local dialect. You'll then head straight down to the Vernon stream which sits in an austere gorge, where you'll cross this sometimes tumultuous torrent on a rather lovely footbridge.
- Alt. 1480 m --- After crossing the stream, take the path to the left which climbs slightly and then levels out. Follow this path for quite a while, taking care on short passages where the slopes can be steep. The path leads to a forest track which you'll take to the right then leave before it descends, taking a path on the left which climbs slightly to arrive at the magnificent meadow of Pré Gaudet. Why not picnic near the forest chalet?





- Alt. 1430 m --- Follow the forest road, Chemin Rouast, for 500 m to a bend, then take a path slightly to the right below the road. Further on, this wide path crosses a stream near a beautiful little waterfall. You'll arrive below the Chamrousse Road. Take this road to the left until the hairpin on the right to arrive at la Baraque de Boulac cabin halfway round this circuit.
- Alt. 1500 m ··· Now you'll change direction to take the path which leaves in the middle of the bend and pushes north-east into the woods as it climbs. This is the GR 738 which crosses the Belledonne and which we will follow to Recoin (it's also partly marked in red and white). The climb is steep before levelling a little at a crossroads where you'll take the path opposite. Follow this path to arrive at a wide, almost flat path which you'll take to the left. At another crossroads, turn right on the path that climbs before levelling out again. You are now just below the road to Roche Béranger (1,658m). Take another small paved road that descends a little and follow it to the arboretum of Recoin. Take the time to visit before returning to the Vernon car park where you set-off. It is also worth visiting the Notre-Dame-des Neiges Chapel and then climbing the steps to visit the Heritage and Environment House and its garden. You'll find information on local flora and fauna.
