The footpaths

A circuit between deciduous and coniferous trees on the western side of Belledonne.

Departure --- Le Pinet d'Uriage.

Access: Coming from Gières, pass the shops in Uriage and turn left at the first roundabout, direction "Chamrousse 1650 - Saint Martin d'Uriage." Pass through Saint Martin village then, at the first hairpin bend turn left in the direction of Saint Nizier-Le Pinet. Follow this road for about 3 km to Le Pinet (ignore all left turns). There's parking beside and opposite the school.

- Alt. 809 m → From Pinet, take the road that climbs towards Les Seiglières (Route de Montrond). After about 500 m turn right onto the steep path Chemin des 3 Pommiers, tarmac at the start. At the top is the hamlet of Replat de Pinet. The road (chemin du Pré-du-Nay) levels out and runs past houses to reach a stone water trough. Continue straight and at the fork, turn slight right onto Chemin Truc and walk uphill straight ahead.
- (3) Alt. 1065 m → On arrival at Les Seiglières, cross the log storage area, pass the small road which arrives on the left (Route Forestière de Montrond) and go straight on to take a pleasant downhill path in the undergrowth. (You'll see some signs). This path passes close to the tarmac road and comes to a wide horizontal track that borders the Marais Chauds pond (hidden). Take this track on the right for 800 m, to arrive at a crossing of marked paths (Carrefour des Marais Chauds).

Remarkable curiosity!

You may want to take a detour to "La Chaise de la Dama" and viewpoint. At the Marais Chauds crossroads, take the track to the left for 60 m then turn sharp right onto another track marked with dotted blue line. Continue for about 150 m arriving at a clearing. Descend to the left through sparse undergrowth to discover on the left "La Chaise de la Dama" on which you can sit! Retrace your steps to continue the circuit.

Alt. 1030 m → Follow the track slightly downhill for 500 m before turning completely to the right (don't go towards the road to Montrond) on a path which descends for a few meters, becomes flat again then turns left at a crossroads. Turn left and continue through a marshy area among sparse deciduous trees. You'll arrive at Grand Gouillat, a water catchment area with reservoirs. Ignore a path on the left (which also joins the road to Montrond) to continue walking flat, by the reservoirs.



After 300 m the path descends more steeply. Before the end of the descent, turn left onto a track that climbs fairly steeply, then undulates through a beautiful forest. Leave this track to take a small zigzag path on the right which climbs a little, then flattens out before reaching a track. Take this track to the right, slightly downhill before you find yourself on a wide platform in front of the "Ferme des Emeus."
